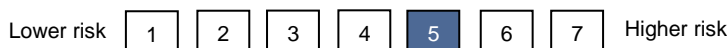
This Fund is actively managed. The benchmark Carnegie Small Cap Nordic (EUR) RI is used for performance comparison only. The Fund is not benchmark constrained and its performance may deviate significantly from that of the benchmark. The Fund seeks to increase the value of its assets over the medium term by investing in shares of Nordic small companies or small companies operating in the Nordic countries: Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden. Environmental, social and governance (ESG) criteria contribute to, but are not a determining factor in, the manager's decision making. Incomes are systematically reinvested. Investors are able to redeem on a daily basis (on Luxembourg bank business days) as described in the prospectus.

### Intended retail investor

This Product is designed for retail investors who have neither financial expertise nor any specific knowledge to understand the Product but nevertheless may bear a total capital loss. It is suited for clients who seek growth of capital. Potential investors should have an investment horizon of at least 5.0 years.
