Objectives

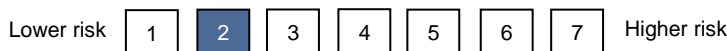
The investment objective of Ostrum Short Term Global High Income Fund (the "Fund") is high total investment return through income. The Fund integrates environmental, social and governance (ESG) criteria. The Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within less than 3 years. The Fund invests primarily in debt securities issued by corporations worldwide with maturities less than 5 years and rated below investment grade. The Fund is actively managed and uses a bottom-up approach to select securities for investment emphasizing fundamental research of individual debt issuers. In addition, the Fund can also implement a top-down and broader approach on credit market (including volatility on credit spread) depending on the portfolio managers' macroeconomic views. The Fund promotes environmental or social characteristics but does not have as its objective a sustainable investment. The Fund adopts a threefold ESG policy which consists of sectoral and exclusion policies, integration of ESG elements into the research process of the underlying issuers and implementation of an ESG selectivity process based on the average ESG rating method.

Intended retail investor

The Product is suitable for investors who are looking for a diversification of their investments in below investment grade securities on a global basis; can afford to set aside capital for at least 3 years (medium term horizon); can accept temporary losses; and can tolerate volatility.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 3 years.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.
